<u>Caregiver</u>: a family member or paid helper who regularly looks after a child or a sick, elderly, or disabled person.

Caregiving is an essential public health service. Caregivers help with a variety of routine tasks such as shopping, helping with finance papers, managing medicines, dressing, and bathing.

The demand for caregivers is growing.

How to Support Caregivers:

- Make sure they are managing their own health care needs
- Help the caregiver with errands or tasks
- Provide emotional & social support, and check in on them

Benefits of Caregiving for Recipients and Caregivers

For the recipient

- Retain their qualify of life and independence
- · Avoid living in a group setting or nursing facility
- Depression is less likely
- Chronic conditions are self managed better

For the caregiver

- Self confidences is higher and fulfilled with helping others

Medicare

- *65years or older
- *To enroll; visit your local Social Security office or call 1-800-772-1213

Medicaid

- *Comprehensive health care insurance for aged, blind and/or disabled adults and families with low income
- *Amount of coverage varies based on income, and assets for certain types of coverage
- *You <u>MUST</u> be US citizen or meet alien status **and** be a Maryland resident

Maryland Senior Call Check Program


Every day a telephone call will be placed to a participant at a regularly scheduled time. If the participant does not answer their first call, two more automated calls will be made. If those calls go unanswered, an alternative person who is selected by the participant during program enrollment will be called. The alternate will then be encouraged to check on the older adult program participant. The failure of the participant and alternate to answer will result in a call to your local non-emergency service. Senior Call Check phone lines are open Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm and Saturday 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. During these hours, seniors can call tollfree 1-866-50-CHECK (1-866-502-0560). Any Maryland resident who is 65 years of age or older who has a landline phone or cell phone (TTY is available). An alternate is a person you have selected to be called in the Senior Call Check program in the event you do not answer your automated call after 3 attempts. This person must be a reliable emergency contact, such as an adult child, a responsible neighbor, or a close relative.

Call toll-free (866)-502-0560 and ask to have a hard copy application mailed to your home.
